Initiatives like Tica Linda are crucial for providing opportunities, entering the specialty market, and ensuring equitable recognition and financial returns for their high quality work. Supporting women in coffee farming directly contributes to enhanced livelihoods, stronger communities, and improved quality throughout the supply chain. By investing in women, initiatives like Tica Linda foster economic resilience and ensure a more equitable future for coffee production. Their dedication and expertise are finally receiving the recognition they deserve. Costa Rica, particularly regions like Tarrazú, is renowned for premium coffee, thriving in ideal high altitude conditions.

Analynn Mata Acuña's farm in Higuito Cartago exemplifies this quality focus. Her family has cultivated coffee here for over 27 years, adhering to best practices for high production standards. Sustainability is key on Analynn's farm. Water used in processing is reused and recycled, preventing pollution. Significantly, out of 125 hectares, only 15 are for coffee cultivation; 115 are dedicated to reforestation efforts.



In 2015, Analynn invested in a micro mill, enabling her to produce and market high quality green coffee directly and add value.

Complementing these efforts, the Tica Linda Women's Project specifically supports and empowers women in coffee production. Its mission is to enhance visibility, strengthen economic independence, and promote women's roles. The project provides training, facilitates access to vital resources and networks, and promotes direct trade relationships for fair pricing. Collaborating with the International Women's Coffee Alliance (IWCA), the project connects participants to a broader global network, resources, and markets, amplifying their impact in the coffee world.

The coffee produced through these women-led initiatives often stands out for its exceptional quality, reflecting the meticulous care and dedication of the farmers.
